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To send, or not to send?

From time to time, your child will wake up in the morning saying that they feel unwell. Whilst we do encourage children to come to school even if they 'feel a little unwell', we do not want any child who is genuinely ill to come to school. Always try to send your child to school if they are a little 'under the weather' for example with a runny nose, headache, and tummy ache. We will always contact you if your child becomes too unwell. Please do not send your child to school if they have any infectious illnesses like chicken pox, measles etc. If your child has been vomiting, or is suffering from diarrhoea, then they should stay away from school for 48 hours from the last bout of illness. This is to ensure that any infection does not spread further.

Penalty Notices

Leave in term time will not be authorised. Unauthorised leave for 10 sessions (5 school days) or more will qualify for a penalty notice (£60 per parent, per child).

Punctuality Matters too!

Missed minutes = missed learning

As a school, we are aware that lateness can severely affect achievement. We monitor punctuality closely and have strategies in place to address lateness.

The school gates are open from 8.50am and are closed at 9:10am.

Any child arriving after this point must report to the school office, as this is the time that registers close. Any child who arrives after 9:30am will be given an unauthorised absence code.
