At Hollin Primary School, we recognise the contribution that P.E and school sports has on the physical and mental health and well-being of our children. We believe that an innovative, varied, P.E curriculum and extra-curricular sports opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. Our Sports Leader (Mr Vyse) has been employed, since 2015, to teach P.E throughout the school and provide a wide range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities. Alongside a Teaching Assistant (Mrs Jones) he enters Hollin children into a wide range of sports fixtures and competitions provided by the Middleton Primary Schools' Sports Association (MPSSA) and wider. This academic year, Mrs Jones will further support the core offer every lunchtime.

Our P.E and Sports funding enables us to extend our provision by employing an additional sports coach at lunchtime and after school.
