At Hollin Primary School, we recognise the contribution that P.E and school sports has on the physical and mental health and well-being of our children. We believe that an innovative, varied, P.E curriculum and extra-curricular sports opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. Our Sports Leader (Mrs Jones) has been appointed to teach P.E throughout the school and provide a wide range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities.

Our P.E and Sports funding enables us to extend our provision by employing an additional sports coach at lunchtime and after school.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that schools should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that it already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
